CBD, not THC

CBD, or cannabidiol, is made of hemp plants are bred to contain CBD and very low amounts of THC. One of the major misconceptions about CBD is that it is the *same* thing as THC. However, it is not. CBD is legal because it contains less than 3% THC, so there's no worry about feeling the psychological and physical effects of being intoxicated.

A major benefit to CBD is pain management; it is also helps when controlling problems with insomnia and anxiety.
